Mexico is experiencing a major manufacturing renaissance that will represent a significant opportunity for Illinois manufacturers. Today the country is the largest exporter of cars and light trucks to the U.S., surpassing Japan in 2013 and on track to surpass Canada this year.

Between 2012 and May of this year, 11 new automotive assembly plants have been announced in Mexico compared to only 5 assembly plants in the U.S. and plant closings in Canada. In addition to the automotive industry, the appliance, off road equipment, aerospace and medical device industries are all driving a demand to localize more than \$50 billion of parts in Mexico.

Mexico is a superior manufacturing and assembly location for many U.S. manufacturers. It provides lower-cost, operationally viable factory solutions close to home, especially for higher-value engineered products and equipment with sensitive logistics considerations. Our speakers will provide insights from their unique perspectives on opportunities in the manufacturing sector as well as the legal and logistics considerations on operations in Mexico.
